Both staff will work with different classes to cover non-class contact time for teachers and Mrs Scott will also cover Primary 2 on Thursday and Friday.


P.E. TIMETABLE

On P.E. days children can wear sports clothing and polo shirts.

SCHOOL APP/PARENT PORTAL

As you are aware, SLC have launched the parent portal which has been designed to reduce paperwork and letters home. We are delighted that most parents across the school have signed up for this and are using it regularly to receive school updates. At the moment, we still continue to use the school app, however, this comes with a significant cost and we will not be continuing with the school app from April 2024.

If you have not yet signed up for the portal I would urge you to do this to ensure that you receive all important information from the school. This will mean the parent portal will be our 'one stop shop' for all communication. In addition to uploading all important documents relating to pupils, the portal also has a range of effective features which we can fully utilise such as an online Parent's Evening booking system. Information on how to access these features will be communicated in the coming months. If you require any support to sign up for the parent portal please contact the school office.

TWITTER

We continue to use our school Twitter to celebrate achievements within school and outside. In order to ensure this information stays within the school community, you must request to join our Twitter page. We often receive requests to join Twitter from unknown names. If your name is different to your child or one that we may not recognise, we would ask that you email the school office to confirm your identity and we can then accept the request.

VISITING THE SCHOOL

If you are visiting the school, please use the buzzer at the front entrance and someone will give you access to the main 'bubble'. We have created a seating area for parents here if you need to speak to a member of the school office or if you are collecting your child.

We hope you will make use of this and feel welcome in our school.

If you would like to speak to a member of staff, please contact the school office to arrange a convenient time. Parents/carers are advised to speak to class teachers in the first instance if this is in relation to a classroom issue. If this relates to additional support or ongoing pastoral support, an appointment can be made with Mrs Graham or Mrs Bradley.

PARENT COUNCIL

BREAKFAST CLUB

Breakfast Club continues to operate from 8.15am each day and is free to school pupils. Pupils should enter through the main entrance into the dining hall. Pupils are asked not to attend before 8.15am and the last serving will be 8.35am. LUNCH

Primary 1-5 pupils are entitled to a free school meal.

UNIFORM DONATIONS

We have a supply of school uniform items (in very good condition) donated from parents/carers. All items are within the entrance area to the school and can be accessed by parents/carers at any time.

We also have a variety of 'lost and found' school clothing that can be accessed at any time.

LENTEN FUNDRAISING

The Pupil Council have been planning fundraising events and a timetable of events will be issued in the coming weeks.

ADVERSE WEATHER

In the event of adverse weather, we courteously ask all parents to:

- Check the school app/twitter regularly for any updates regarding school arrangements
- Where possible, ensure appropriate outdoor footwear (waterproof) is worn by pupils (We do not recommend that pupils wear the same shoes outdoors and indoors)
- Provide pupils with appropriate indoor shoes that can be worn inside the school building
- Ensure pupils have warm/waterproof jackets, including hats/gloves etc
- Provide spare socks/tights (in school bag) that pupils can use if required

We have a small supply of clothing items in the school that can be used for pupils who require additional items of clothing and we will do out best to cater to the needs of all.

TOYS We continue to ask for your support in ensuring that pupils do not bring toys/football cards etc to school. As you may be aware, this can cause upset if personal items are lost or damaged. Pupils should keep personal items at home and make use of resources within the school.
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LATE COMING/ABSENCE

We continue to promote good time keeping across the school and encourage all pupils to attend school on time. As you will be aware, this impacts learning within the class as teachers begin their lessons and many pupils are missing vital teaching. It is important that pupils arrive in school for 9am in order to ensure that they are able to fully engage in all learning opportunities.

If your child is going to be absent from school please telephone or email the school office before 9.30am if possible.
