Contact details, medical information and medicine

All parents are reminded to update the school with any changes to parent or emergency contact details or to their child's medical records. If your child requires medicine to be administered in school, please hand this in to the school office and complete the appropriate paperwork. Parents are reminded that under no circumstances should children keep medication in their school bag.

Allergy reminder

Thank you for your support in ensuring no nut products are sent into school. Your cooperation in this matter is much appreciated. I would also ask that parents refrain from sending birthday cakes and treats to school to avoid these being distributed to children with allergies.

Time Keeping

An increasing number of children have been arriving late for school. The morning bell rings at 8:55am and children should be ready to line up at this time. Late arrival to school, even if only a short time, will have an impact on your child's settling into school and readiness to learn. Please make every effort to ensure your child is in school on time every morning.

Mobile Phones

Children should not be using mobile phones within the school, this includes in the playground in the morning. Any child bringing a mobile phone to school should hand this in to the school office in the morning and this can be collected again at the end of the day.

Road Safety

We are continuing to work with the children in school to remind them of the importance of road safety. We have appointed a Junior Road Safety Officer for each class who will help to ensure that Road Safety remains a priority within our classes and across the school. At the Parent Council AGM some parents raised concerns about the business of the car park and our entrance being used as a turning point. This is being monitored.

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After School Clubs

The attendance at our after school clubs has been excellent this term. **Parents are reminded that handball, basketball and dance clubs all cost £1 per week.** I would like to express my continued gratitude to Mr Binnie, Mr Jolly, Mrs Ramsay, Ms Robertson and Luke Kirwan for continuing to volunteer with our football, athletics and netball clubs.

If your child is unable to attend an after school club on a certain day, please notify the school in advance so the club register can be marked accordingly.

Parents are reminded that athletics club will change from a Wednesday to a Friday 3-4pm beginning on Friday 30th September.

Athletics- SSAA Road Relay in Grangemouth

This event will take place on Saturday 21st October. Some parents have expressed an interest in putting forward a team however due to the cost of supplying transport, and the fact that this event will be held during the October holidays, the school are unable to accompany the children to the event. I am happy to enter a school team but parents would have to take responsibility for transporting children to and from the event. A letter will be distributed to the parents of selected team members next week.

Pupil Voice in St. Hilary's

In order to continuously develop and encourage pupil participation every child in the school is given the opportunity to have their ideas and opinions listened to. We have different ways in which we will achieve this including our pupil council, learner conversations, our comments and suggestions display and our pupil voice groups. These groups give children the opportunity to contribute to the planning and decision making within the school. Every child will have the opportunity to attend a Pupil Voice Group meeting throughout the year. Pupil voice groups will discuss topics including fundraising, school improvement plans, citizenship, Eco and safety.

Forest Schools

In partnership with East Kilbride Community Trust, a group of our P6 children have been enjoying weekly visits to Peel Park to participate in Forest Schools. The children are having a wonderful experience and I look forward to being able to extend the forest school experience to more of our children later in this school year.

Sponsored Read-a-thon

Our sponsored read-a-thon will take place over the September weekend. This fundraising event has been organised to help support the purchase of books and materials for our library and sensory room. I would remind parents that only one sheet need to be returned per family if this is preferable. For younger children the number of pages read include those that parents have read to their child. 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School Improvement Plan Update

- Introduced 'Big Writing' across the school.
- Created a new library that the pupils can visit with their class.
- Been working with St. Leonard's library and have created a calendar of visits and will be working in collaboration with Libraries' Children's Team to develop our own lending library.
- Celebrated the joy of reading daily during fruit break.
- Had fun raising the profile of books and reading on our Dahlicious day.
- Introduced Personal Learning Plans.
- Reviewed and adapted our approaches to planning for learning in line with current education advice in order to make learning and teaching within our classrooms more creative and responsive to the needs of our pupils.

Uniform

- The children continue to look very smart in their school uniform. The high standard and consistency of school uniform gives an excellent first impression of our school and we have been getting many complements from visitors. Parents are reminded that our school uniform is black trousers or skirt with a white shirt and school tie and a **red** jumper or cardigan. Children are asked to wear black shoes to school, black trainers are acceptable. Similarly indoor shoes should be dark, ideally black plimsolls and not colourful trainers.
