"As an inclusive community of faith and learning we are committed to providing the highest quality of education in an environment that respects the rights, dignity and voice of each person."




OUR AIMS

New Routines – your school day

In primary school you will be used to working in your classroom with mainly one teacher.

At secondary school this is usually different. You may move to different classrooms for different subjects and will quickly get to know your way around.

It is a common worry that you will get lost or not be able to find the classroom you are looking for, but there will be plenty of people to help you find your way and make sure that you are ok.

The times for the school day are different too.

Monday 8:45 am - 2:55 pm Tuesday 8:45 am - 3:45 pm Wednesday 8:45 am - 2:55 pm Thursday 8:45 am - 3:45 pm Friday 8:45 am - 2:55 pm



Each day you will get a 15-minute interval from 10:35 am until 10:50 am.

Lunch on shorter days (Monday, Wednesday and Friday) is 50 minutes from 12.30 pm until 1.20 pm.


Lunch on the longer days (Tuesday and Thursday) is 50 minutes from 1.15pm until 2.05 pm.

On the next page you will see a Timetable which will look like the one you will have to tell you which class to go to and when the bells will ring:

New Routines – Registration Time

Every morning there is a ten-minute registration. A warning bell will ring a couple of minutes before registration begins; it is to remind you to start making your way to your registration class so that you are on time.

The second bell will ring at 8:45 am to start the registration period.



Your registration teacher will say the school prayer with you, check you are wearing school uniform and that you have your homework diary. They will read the school bulletin which will give you news and information about what is on in school.

If you have been absent from school or have a doctor or dentist appointment your parent/guardian should write a letter for your registration teacher. They will give you a 'Blue Slip' if you need to get out of school early for an appointment and you give this to the office staff when you need to leave.

New Routines – Your New Uniform

Every day you are expected to wear full school uniform which consists of

- Plain white shirt
- St. Andrew's and St. Bride's High School tie
- Plain black v-necked jumper or cardigan (optional)
- Plain black trousers/black or tartan skirt
- Plain black shoes
- St. Andrew's and St. Bride's High School blazer



• Outerwear (coats, hats, etc.) may be worn in inclement weather. However, all of these should be removed when in the school building. (Lockers are available throughout the school.

Things you need to bring to school

Every day you will need to bring with you pencils, a pen, a sharpener, an eraser, and a ruler. A scientific calculator is useful, but do not worry if you do not have one, your teachers will be able to give you advice on that. It will also be necessary to bring a private reading book, fact or fiction, as you will be asked to read for pleasure during registration each day and at the start of each English lesson.

You will need to bring your Young Scot Card, which you use for free school lunches or topped up with money from parent pay. You can also bring a packed lunch. S1 are not allowed to leave the school campus at lunchtime.

Lunchtime Clubs

What should I do if....? (some worries that pupils told us they have)

1. I want to know what class I will be in?

At the minute we are still working on this, we will give you this information as soon as it becomes available.



Try not to worry. If you are on your way to school and it makes you late, report to the school office when you get in and they will give you a slip to take to your class teacher.

If you miss the bus at home time, come back up and tell a teacher or a member of the office and arrangements will be made to get you home.

3. I forgot my packed lunch or lunch money?

Go to the school office. Money can be given to you on loan until the next day. There will always be a way to get you some lunch.

4. I do not understand my work?

Always ask your teacher or a support assistant for help as they may not be aware that you have not understood. They will always try to help you



5. I do not have my Homework?

Teachers understand that pupils sometimes forget their homework and will take this into consideration, but please get into a good habit of writing your homework in your homework diary and checking it every night. If you were unable to do your homework for a good reason, please speak to your teacher or go to the Homework Club to get support with it.



6. I forget my P.E kit?

Sometimes there are spare kits available in PE that you can borrow, however, it is better to bring your own. Remember to use your homework diary and timetable to remind you of the items that you need for each day and pack your bag carefully the night before.





7. I am worried or upset?

Firstly, do not keep it to yourself. Talk to your Pupil Support Teacher or any other member of staff that you feel comfortable talking to.
