ADVERSE WEATHER

In the event of adverse weather, we courteously ask all parents to:

- Check the school portal/X regularly for any updates regarding school arrangements
- Ensure appropriate outdoor footwear is worn by pupils
- Provide pupils with appropriate indoor shoes that can be worn inside the school building and for PE
- Ensure pupils have warm/waterproof jackets, including hats/gloves etc
- Provide spare socks/tights (in school bag) that pupils can use if required

We have a small supply of clothing items in the school that can be used for pupils who require additional items of clothing and we will do our best to cater to the needs of all.

CAR PARK

I have been contacted by several parents who have been unable to use the disabled spaces in the car park due to them being occupied by cars not displaying a badge. I'm sure you can appreciate that this may cause them distress. These spaces should only be used by people who have the required documentation and I would ask you to consider this when using the car park.

PUPIL AND PARENT FOCUS GROUPS

ANTI-BULLYING

This session, we would like to develop a new Anti-Bullying Policy with some members of our pupil council and a small group of parents. We feel that this would support us in providing a balanced view from all stakeholders. This would involve two meetings during the school day (days can be confirmed depending on availability). NUMERACY

As part of the SLC Numeracy Strategy, Mrs Frame will be delivering a series of pupil/parent numeracy workshops. They are designed to help parents to learn strategies to support pupils with early numeracy skills. The workshops will take place in the school for 6 weeks from Thursday 24 April 9.15-10.15am. SNACKS


In line with SLC, we promote healthy snacks and nutrition within the school. We ask that pupils do not bring fizzy/energy drinks to school. We also ask for your support in not bringing lollipops as this is a safety concern when pupils are running around.

CARDS

We ask that pupils do not bring football cards etc to school. This can cause distress if they are lost or swapped without adult supervision. Many thanks for your support in this area.

SLC PUPIL ATTENDANCE FRAMEWORK

SLC have clear guidance for schools in relation to pupil attendance. This is being monitored very closely across the authority and schools must issue a range of letters to parents/carers if attendance falls within the categories listed below:



National guidance states that, 'The cumulative impact of missed days at school can have detrimental and long lasting consequences and can significantly impact on positive destinations and outcomes for children and young people'.

We want to ensure that we promote good attendance across the school and this framework will support us in this area.

If you receive an attendance support letter, please contact the school to discuss this.

PARENT PORTAL

This is our main source of communication and we ask that you check this regularly for messages, letters and calendar updates. The office regularly update the calendar with upcoming events so please make use of this to keep abreast of times and details of events. If you receive an email from the office, they courteously ask that you reply with your child's names and class to confirm that you have received the message. Thank you for support in this area.

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We continue to use social media platform X (formally Twitter) to celebrate achievements within school and outside. In order to ensure this information stays within the school community, you must request to join our private page. If your name is different to your child or one that we may not recognise, we would ask that you email the school office to confirm your identity and we can then accept the request.

PARENT COUNCIL

The Parent Council continue to work tirelessly to support pupils across the school and without their fundraising efforts, many activities would not take place. You may or may not be aware that, in line with SLC guidelines, the Parent Council have to pay for the hire of the hall/school outwith school hours but costs for events is kept to a minimum in line with the school's cost of the school day policy.

We fully appreciate the ongoing support and kind donations of parents and families which allow us to reduce costs for all. All monies raised goes directly back to the pupils in some way so this support is vital for our ongoing progress. Currently we have a small committee, but the Parent Council are always looking for new members to support their ongoing work. LATE COMING/ABSENCE

We continue to promote good time keeping across the school and encourage all pupils to attend school on time. As you will be aware, this impacts learning within the class as teachers begin their lessons and many pupils are missing vital teaching. It is important that pupils arrive in school for 9am in order to ensure that they are able to fully engage in all learning opportunities. In recent months, we have also had a higher number of pupils not being collecting from school at 3pm. We understand that there can be emergency situations but supervising pupils after 3pm is difficult as we often have staff meetings.
